Thu	3 rd	the Malawi container: generosity in donating all equipment needed to combat Covid; the safe travel of the container
Fri	4 th	Alex and Mari and family moving house; Alex's work in Sierra Leone; funding for Mari's colleague to help bereaved mothers; all friends in South Africa waiting for supplies of covid vaccine
Sat	5 th	the people of Goma in Congo where a volcano has erupted
Sun	6 th	worshippers on Zoom; leaders at Holy Communion
Mon	7 th	the people of Gaza and Israel: a permanent settlement of their differences; avoidance of further war
Tue	8 th	every person who works in the health service and in care for the elderly, sick and vulnerable – doctors, nurses, cleaners, porters, ambulance staff and administrative personnel: strength for each day and good rest in their free time
Wed	9 th	our people who spend every day alone in their home
Thu	10 th	God's presence in the smiles and greetings of our neighbours
Fri	11 th	Rob's prayer for us is that we go on looking out for, serving, and reaching out to those in the community who don't yet know Jesus, and that we do not become inward looking; that we continue to pray for and support our mission partners and the worldwide church, where needs are greater than ever
Sat	12 th	those who live in refugee camps and fear an outbreak or the spread of the coronavirus
Sun	13 th	God's people on Zoom and at All Age Worship today
Mon	14 th	the people of Afghanistan as foreign troops prepare to withdraw from their territory

Tue	15 th	the churchwardens and PCC managing our churches in the vacancy; Nicola as she links all together; the lay readers planning and leading services
Wed	16 th	tea farmers in Kenya facing lower yields due to climate change and locust damage; tea farmers in India, Sri Lanka and China
Thu	17 th	security of water supply in all countries
Fri	18 th	the people of Yemen: freedom from everyday danger; that all come to have access to food, health care and life without fear
Sat	19 th	North Korea and other places hidden from the media and the political arena, where people suffer disease, malnutrition, and lack humanitarian aid, health care and clean water

Mon	21 st	plans for social interaction and safety as lockdown is eased
Tue	22 nd	our people as they faithfully pray and look for God's healing in their lives and the lives of others
Wed	23 rd	remembering all that makes us full of hope
Thu	24 th	Syria: that a stable situation would return to the country, enabling its people to return to a secure life
Fri	25 th	for all humanity to take a long hard look at itself and learn from what we have endured and experienced during the covid crisis
Sat	26 th	John and Rachel working for the Lord in the Middle East; John and his team translating Ezra, the Psalms and Jonah into the local language; healing for John's migraines; Rachel as she works on language learning and plans a return to the UK
Sun	27 th	our part of God's family as we worship on Zoom or at All Age Worship today
Mon	28 th	Lord, help us all to play our part in the ministry, service, and outreach of your church; as we prepare to recruit a new vicar bring to us the woman or man you are calling to serve here
