We at St Andrew's and St Michael's are committed to ensuring that we offer a sincere welcome within a safe environment for all who belong and worship with us. We are dedicated to creating a welcoming and safe place for all who wish to encounter God and join as part of our Church family.

Ensuring a safe environment means that we pay particular attention and take special measures to protect those who are particularly vulnerable such as children, young people and vulnerable adults. We have policies for each of these groups and these policies can be found under the **Contact tab** on our website. We take the safety of everyone very seriously and expect that everyone will work within the church's safeguarding policies. As parish churches we have due regard for all the procedure and guidance documents produced centrally by the Church of England (including the Parish Safeguarding Handbook).

Although we have particular people who bear formal responsibility for safeguarding, 'the care and protection of children, young people and vulnerable adults involved in church activities is the responsibility of the whole church' (Promoting a Safer Church, 2017).
