

Monday Fellowship

The March Monday Fellowship should be very interesting. It is all about Ethiopia, a country that probably very few have visited from North Worcestershire and about a very special hospital. It is also an extremely poor country in North East African. The hospital is based in Addis Ababa, founded in 1974 by two Australian physicians. It is the only hospital in the world totally dedicated to treating women with obstectric fistula and all treatment is free of charge. Come on Monday 11th March to the parish centre at 2.30pm to hear Peter Jackson give an illustrated talk on the history of the this unusual hospital, followed by a cup of tea and biscuits.
