#### Monday Fellowship 11th November

At the eleventh hour on the eleventh day of the eleventh month in 1918, the First World war finally came to an end after a terrible sacrifice of young talent in the previous four years of warfare. Cemetries across Northern France and Belgium are a reminder of the terrible tragedy of this war as are the poppies sold to the public at this time of the year.

Local historian, retired deputy headmaster, and excellent local speaker Philip Bowen will tell us the story and the effect of 190 boys from Bromsgrove School who gave their lives in such a fruitless waste of youth. It is coincidence that Remembrance Day falls on the same day as Monday Fellowship and therefore gives us the chance to hear a talk about such a tragic loss.
