What happens to our shoebox full of stamps?

Birmingham City Mission collects stamps from various sources, including ourselves, and then sells them on in bulk (kiloware) to big stamp companies. The stamps are divided into, say, GB/ Europe/ World and sold on to collectors in smaller transparent bags. Collectors then carefully soak the stamps in warm water and detach them from their backing. The stamps are then dried and mounted. Given the difficulty of separating modern stamps some collectors neatly trim the backing and mount their stamps that way. Either way the demand for used stamps remains - as does our now empty shoebox in the porch in St Andrews - sob!

Cut food waste. When you're food shopping, try to choose things that are light on packaging, or buy loose items. If you end up over catering, don't just bin what's left. Transforming leftovers can be a great way to create new meals, save money and cut waste. Try the BBC Good Food leftovers recipes online for ideas. Or challenge your family to suggest recipes with whatever you've got in the fridge. If you have too many leftovers, see what you can freeze. Or why not donate some to an elderly neighbour, local foodbank or soup kitchen. Compost any uncooked waste.
