Sat	6 th	the shoebox appeal: thanks for the time and help already given; pray for generosity in financial giving

Mon	8 th	the Monday Fellowship team as they begin a new year
Tue	9 th	the people of Israel and Palestine: release from famine, from danger;
Wed	10 th	the people of Ukraine: constancy in prayer; God's hand on fighting for what is right; President Zelensky; may peace negotiations be true to God's plan for His people

Thu	18 th	our people who have been ill or under medical treatment; those who have been caring for them
Fri	19 th	Stuart and Laxmi's work for women in Nepal; that their input can help prevent sex trafficking
Sat	20 th	the people of Yemen; forgotten parts of the world still in conflict
Sun	21 st	the bounty of harvest; joy and celebration at God' provision
Mon	22 nd	being constant in donations to the foodbank at St Stephen's and in our giving elsewhere
Tue	23 rd	may we leave ourselves room to listen to the spirit , to embrace the unintended and unseen if God calls us to
